### **Jack Burkert: Women of Baltimore...Who Made a Difference**

The history of Baltimore is one of individual and collective actions that enhanced and improved the city. The names Pratt, Hopkins, Patterson and more are well known, but these men were not alone in acts of boldness, of courage, of humanity. There were dozens of Baltimore women, little known, even unknown, who made a difference with their work and their commitment to the general welfare. This

program offers a few of their stories, as many as time will permit, a few of the many that could have been included. Here presented are the lives of a few Baltimore Women whose actions, whose lives, improved the lives of others – locally, nationally, internationally. Jack Burkert, a Baltimore native and Poly High graduate, in retirement has used his energy and interest in “all things Baltimore” to create educational programs serving as a part-time educator at the Baltimore Museum of Industry as well as through his own consulting firm. A 1969 honors graduate of the University of Maryland, Jack completed a degree in history and education. His working life, some 40+ years, was spent in various educator roles, with the Baltimore City School system, the Pennsylvania State University, plus private employers in Washington and New York City.

### **Roswell Encina: Still Telling America's Story, Just a Different Address**

In this presentation, Roswell Encina reflects on nine transformative years at the Library of Congress, where he served as Chief Communications Officer and senior advisor to Librarian of Congress Carla Hayden. Together with an Extraordinary team, he worked to make the library more relatable, visible, and welcoming to the public, elevating its name by opening the doors to its unparalleled collections, America's treasures. From the papers of 23 presidents to the legacies of history makers such as

Rosa Parks and Alexander Hamilton, and cultural giants including Stephen Sondheim, George and Ira Gershwin, and Leonard Bernstein, the work centered on connecting people to the stories that shape who we are. Through major national moments like the National

Book Festival and the Gershwin Prize for Popular Song, the Library became not just a repository of history, but a living, breathing cultural force.

Encina now brings that same passion for access, relevance, and storytelling to his role as President and CEO of the United States Capitol Historical Society. At the Society, he is focused on elevating history and civics for the public, helping people see themselves in the Capitol, and strengthening the connection between democratic ideals and everyday life. The presentation traces this from stewarding the nation's memory at the Library of Congress to advancing civic understanding at the heart of American democracy.
